## GROUNDS REPORT



Accessibility Project- Phase 1

We are just waiting for a window of dry weather for ASL Paving to come out and finish the ramp from the handicap parking area to the main gate. They will also finish the necessary paving for water flow in the parking lot. The new driveway has been packed and seems to be holding up well. The ramp to the main level, built by JR's Welding, is better than our wildest dreams.

Plans are in progress to stucco the trim areas around the windows & doors on the south side of the clubhouse.

New water sprinklers for the lawn, a small drainage ditch/weeping tile along the south side of the old driveway and either repairing or replacing the storage shed, are all projects on the books for this summer/fall.

We plan to replace the bright fish fly attracting light on the NW dock with a low wattage light that shines only on the entrance.

There are several aluminium docks that require welding/repair which will be a fall project.

Next winter/spring we need to seriously consider adding more rocks to build up the east breakwater as well as some repair work on the north breakwater.

A new pricing structure has been put in place for fuel sales. At the beginning of this season the Club began selling fuel (regular grade from this point forward) priced at 15 cents per litre over the prevailing price. This price premium was necessitated by our very low profit margins on fuel sales. However, we are not passing on the full cost of this premium to our members. From now on, when members purchase fuel from the Club, you will be asked to provide your membership number in order to track purchases. For every litre purchased by a member, you will receive a 10 cent credit against next year's membership dues and/or fees. This credit can only be applied against the next year's fees and any unused credit cannot be rolled forward to the following year.
